If you want to become an expert in the fields of Project Planning, Management and Evaluation for the development of your community and nation.

### What will you Study under MAPME?

You will study 10 core courses ranging from: Project Planning and Appraisal; Project Monitoring and Evaluation; Statistical Methods for Project Management; Environmental and Social Impact Assessment; Development Planning; Project Financing; Managing Development Projects; Budgeting and Accounting for Project Managers; Impact Evaluations; Social Science Research Methodology; and Research Innovations and Commercialization.

### What can you Do with MAPME?

Graduates from MAPME program are expected to work in: government departments, local government, national and international agencies, local and international NGOs, the private sector, research and academia, and self-employment in the areas of project monitoring and evaluation. In addition, completion of the degree allows graduates to apply for accreditation with the National Environmental Council of Tanzania as experts in the fields of social and environmental impact assessment. The MAPME programme will be a pathway to pursue a PhD in Project Management.

### Who Should Apply for MAPME?

In addition to general admission requirements, apply if you hold: a) an unclassified degree with at least an average of B in a course

- related to the MAPME. b) a PASS degree and your undergraduate performance in a course related to the MAPME was a B grade average or above, and have extensive fieldwork/research experience of at least three years
- and/or additional professional development courses of a duration not less than three months.

## What will you Study under MADPPA?

You will study 10 core courses ranging from: Planning Theory and Practice; Development Policy and Practice; Computable General Equilibrium Modelling; Development Planning; Policy Impact Analysis; Policy formulation and Advocacy; Community Planning and Participation; Social Policy, Society and Change; Research Design and Methods; and Public Policy Analysis. Besides, You have a room to choose some courses from a pool of electives and write a dissertation.

## What can you Do with MADPPA?

Graduates of MADPPA program will develop comprehensive skills directly related to employment in the private or government sectors and companies, agencies and departments involved in local, regional and international development planning, consulting, project management, aid agencies and infrastructure planning. Graduates may be recruited into a variety of roles such as development planners, policy analyst, policy advisor, consultant or project officer. The MADPPA programme will be a pathway to pursue a PhD in development planning and policy.

## Who Should Apply for MADPPA?

In addition to general admission requirements, apply if you hold:

- related to the MA DPPA.
- not less than three months.
- an introductory (basic) level.
